National Night Out 2024: Neighbors, First Responders Party for Safety!

Another Great Year for NNO!

Citizens, law enforcement agencies, community groups, businesses, youth organizations and local, state and federal officials from 17,104 communities from all

50 states, U.S. territories and military bases worldwide joined forces to celebrate the 41st Annual National Night Out (NNO) – a community crime prevention and safety event sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch in partnership with ADT, Starbucks, 7-Eleven, Nintendo, Dollar Tree, Associa, L.E.A.D. and Swank Motion Pictures.

"NNO Coordinators did an amazing job of putting together powerful yet fun events," said Matt Peskin, creator of NNO and National Project Coordinator. "The organizational efforts began early in the year and culminated in an array of spectacular celebrations."

He added, "A salute to our amazing corporate partners who help us do what we do year in and year out. Their support and leadership make the NNO engine run and we thank them for standing behind National Night Out."

Throughout the nation, along with the traditional 'lights on' and front porch vigils, there were tens of thousands of block parties, cookouts, parades, potlucks, ice cream socials, neighborhood visits by local police, flashlight walks, safety fairs, poster contests, festivals and other unique events and activities.

Glen Brooks, Chicago Police Department's director of community policing said, "National Night Out is a celebration of communities coming together with their police officers. Really neighbors coming together and celebrating working in partnership to create safer neighborhoods."

VanDella Menifee, President, Lake Parks HOA said, "I love my city. Grand Rapids is not just a place where you be proud as a citizen, it's a place where you feel welcome as a family. Every year our community plays a part in the annual National Night Out by bringing neighbors, police, fire and city officials together."

David Spigelmyer, UT Dallas Police Department said, "I am so honored to have spent over half of my law enforcement career promoting, organizing and participating in NNO! When people come up to me and call me Mr. NNO, I fill up with such joy knowing that I have been an extension of Matt's baby that he started so many years ago." to those in need. Families expressed enthusiasm for NNO and often requested extended hours to interact with all of the participating organizations. Many groups have stated that it's their favorite event of the year."

Lt. Colonel Badgerow of the Chesterfield County Police Department said, "Our most precious commodity is our time. We are humbled that each year on National Night Out so many of our residents choose to spend their time with us, and we are honored to spend our time with them. We're thankful for everyone who chose to share a smile, a handshake or a meal with us this year. We can't wait to do it again next year and for years to come."

Joyce Lee of Chino Hills, CA said, "NNO helps to revitalize neighborhood watch groups that have lost their momentum. It also promoted the 'good neighbor' feeling within the community. NNO is a great way for first responders to put a face to the name and engage in face-to-face communications."

Alicia Ayala of the Grand Prairie, TX, Police Department said, "This initiative is designed to reduce the victimization of children in targeted geographic area of our city. We also had food drives, gave away shoes to those in need and even created smiles with new bikes. There is no question that neighborhood participation in our NNO was a point of pride for our community and was one of our largest yet. We can proudly say that NNO has built the framework for quality relationships and has now elevated to a new level of problem solving unlike any other."

Sara Wood of the Kent, WA, Police Department said, "The residents get to know their neighbors better and we hear some valuable discussions about their neighborhood. Neighbors use NNO to put out maps and contact information for setting up a Block Watch. One neighborhood coordinator states that this is only time of year that her neighbors come out and talk to each other."

Jeremiah Ellison of Minneapolis said, "My team and I had an incredible time connecting with neighbors during National Night Out. I am grateful for all of our community members that took the time and energy to organize a NNO block party. It was so lovely to see how much fun the kids were having."

Chief Tony Martinez of the Dimmitt, TX, Police Department said, "I believe that NNO benefits the Dimmitt/Castro County communities by bringing unity for one day. It allows our community to see our law enforcement agencies in a positive setting and not just when they are called for a negative situation. It allows officers to converse with the community about any issues that concern them. NNO also allows entities such as our crisis center, panhandle transit and other available services to introduce to those who might otherwise not know that they exist."

NATW 2024 AWARD WINNERS

ARLINGTON, TX was selected as the top-ranked Category 1 area and received the National Night Out Cup. Orlando was second, Chesterfield County, VA was third and Minneapolis, MN was fourth.

<u>RICHARDSON, TX</u> won the Cup in Category 2. Brooklyn Park, MN, won in Category 3 and New Brighton, MN captured Category 4. St. Francis, WI, took Category 5 and Bullard, TX finished first in Category 6.

TEXAS was awarded the "National Night Out 2024 State Cup."

The "42nd Annual National Night Out" will culminate on August 5, 2025. (The Texas/October date will be October 7th.)




